Tuesday & Wednesday, Feb. 26 & 27 - Beeson Lecture Series: Fleming Rutledge

Fleming Rutledge is a preacher and teacher known throughout the mainline Protestant denominations of the US, Canada and parts of the UK. She is the author of five books and has received a grant from the Louisville Foundation to complete a book about the meaning of the Crucifixion. One of the first women to be ordained to the priesthood of the Episcopal Church, she served for fourteen years on the clergy staff at Grace Church on Lower Broadway at Tenth Street, New York City. A native of Franklin, Virginia, Mrs. Rutledge was married in 1959 to Reginald E. (Dick) Rutledge and they have two daughters and two grandchildren. <http://www.generousorthodoxy.org>

1. Learn about the ways of healing: prayer, Holy Communion, positive thinking, memory therapy, exercise physiology, nutrition, emotional support system, medicine, surgery, counseling, humor, etc.
