#### **Tuesday, Oct. 30 - Tammy Hutchins, Missionary to India**

Tammy Hutchins graduated from the University of Georgia, where she was active in the Wesley Foundation in 1994, with a Bachelor of Arts in Education. She came to Asbury Seminary in 1994 as a relatively new Christian and graduated in 1997 with a Masters of Arts in World Missions and Evangelism. After graduating, she spent one month in India and visited again later for a six month period. She went again in late 1998 for good, opening Kirubai Homes in 1999. The home began with two Indian friends and two children. Today they have 49 children and 15 staff persons. She was honored by Asbury Seminary a few years back as a Distinguished Alumna.

#### **Wednesday, Oct. 31 - Kingdomtide Celebration: Story, Song, and Sacrament (with Lisa and Will Samson)**

Lisa Samson is an award-winning author who has written over twenty novels. Her most recent novel, *Quaker Summer*, received a starred review from Publisher's Weekly. Will Samson is a PhD student in sociology at the University of Kentucky where he is working on research in the areas of sustainability and Christian community. He is currently studying New Monasticism as a social movement, and was recently awarded the Gilbert Beers Fellowship for his paper, "*Christians for the Mountains: An Evangelical Response to Mountaintop Removal.*" They, along with their three children, Ty, Jake and Gwynnie, live in Lexington, KY as part of Communality, an intentional Christian community dedicated to living out the call of the gospel in tangible ways.
