for singles, commuters, and mini-term

general information

- For Seminary housing, applications are required with a \$100 deposit (\$50 if applying for housing during a mini-term). The deposit will be refunded if the Seminary is unable to assign housing for the term for which you applied or you decline the offer at the time of assignment.
- A student must be accepted for admission before housing applications can be submitted, and assignments are made by application date. New international students are given priority. If you decline an assignment, you can stay on the waiting list in the original order, although declining two offers will move your application to the bottom of the list.
- When you move in, your deposit becomes part of the damage and cleaning deposit which will be refunded to you when you move out if you leave the unit in satisfactory condition.
- To reside in Seminary housing, you must be a full-time student, i.e., registered for nine or more hours per semesters (or "pursuing a full course of study").
- No business ventures requiring local-authority permits are allowed in or on Seminary property.
- Absolutely no animals/pets of any kind, weapons, firearms, or flammable materials are permitted in or on Seminary property.
- The residence hall is both a home and study hall for its residents.

frequently asked questions

Who can live on campus?

Single students are allowed to occupy residence hall rooms during the period of their full-time enrollment at the Seminary.

What if I have visitors?

Only persons assigned to a residence hall room are entitled to reside in the residence halls. Short term visits by relatives and friends are allowed. Overnight visitors (of the same gender) must register with the Resident Assistant and are entitled to stay three nights without charge.

Can I bring a microwave?

Cooking appliances (including microwaves) are not permitted in individual rooms. Kitchens are available with microwaves for use by residents.

Where can I do my laundry?

Laundry facilities are located in the lower level for students' use and contain coin-operated washers and dryers.

Can I get extra storage?

Storage areas or storage cases are available.

Is phone service provided?

Rooms are equipped with a phone jack. Hookup/service are the students' responsibility.

What about cable and internet?

Cable television/VCRs are available in the main lounges of each residence hall. Cable hookup is not permitted in individual rooms. The residence halls are equipped with wireless connections to the campus network and the Internet.

Do I have to purchase a meal plan?

All full-time residents are required to purchase a meal plan for use in the Seminary's dining hall.

What will my address be?

The mailing address for on-campus residents is: 204 N. Lexington Ave., Wilmore, KY 40390 and must include the student's name and SPO number.

Are there Resident Assistants?

Resident Assistants live on every floor.

** This amount will be charged to a student's bill only if they attend the fall and the January session but do not enroll in the spring session OR they come in January and enroll in the spring session. This is a discounted charge. If a student begins in January but does not enroll in the spring session, their account will be assessed an additional charge for the difference between this rate and the regular, full monthly rate. A student who lives in the residence hall for both the fall and spring sessions of one academic year will not be assessed a January charge.

commuter & mini-term housing

Housing may be available in the residence halls for students who commute to the Wilmore campus on a regular basis during the semester sessions and stay for up to four nights per week. Short-term stays may also be available for commuters, ExL students, and other persons who take mini-term courses during January term (J-term) or one of the summer sessions. All such housing is limited and is available on a first-come-first-serve basis.

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NOTE: These rates apply to all non-full-time residents living in residence hall housing during January or any summer term and to commuters who stay for four nights or less per week during the semesters. For non-full-time residents who stay in residence hall housing beyond three consecutive weeks, each consecutive week beyond the third week will be charged at 50% of the standard weekly rate.

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
